



**THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF ORANGEVILLE**

**BY-LAW NUMBER 73-2007**

**A BY-LAW TO PROHIBIT THE SALE OF GOODS/SERVICES  
FROM HIGHWAYS**

WHEREAS Section 8 of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, S.O. 2001, c 25, confers broad authority on the municipality to enable it to govern its affairs as it considers appropriate;

AND WHEREAS on June 11, 2007, Council considered a report (CL-2007-07) reviewing the Short Term Sales By-law and passed motion # 9 to implement option 4 of the report (do not require licences for door-to-door or short term sales);

**NOW THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF ORANGEVILLE ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:**

**1 DEFINITIONS**

“highway” means a common and public highway and includes a street and a bridge forming part of a highway or on, over or across which a highway passes, and includes both the traveled and untravelled portions of the roadway, and all property between the property lines, and lanes and sidewalks.

**2 SALES PROHIBITED**

No person shall sell or offer for sale any goods, wares, merchandise or services on the highways or on vacant lots adjacent to them.

**3 EXEMPTION**

The following are exempt from the requirements of this by-law:

- 3.1 Events organized by the Town of Orangeville, Orangeville Business Improvement Area, and the Orangeville Farmers’ Market.
- 3.2 Specific community events authorized by resolution of Council.
- 3.3 Boulevard cafés authorized by a Town of Orangeville permit.
- 3.4 Merchandise displayed in accordance with the Town’s “Display of Merchandise By-law.”


**4 REPEALING SECTION**


By-Law 118-2004 “Short Term Sales By-law” is hereby repealed.

**5 EFFECTIVE DATE**

This by-law shall take effect on the date of passing.
