By-law Number 2023-060

A by-law to amend By-law 2016-110 being a By-law to prescribe the types of fires, time during which fires may be set, and the precautions to be observed by the person(s) setting fires in the open air; and the requirements and fees for fire permits

Whereas Council passed By-law 2016-110 on October 17, 2016 to prescribe the types of fires, time during which fires may be set, and the precautions to be observed by the person(s) setting fires in the open air; and the requirements and fees for fire permits;

And whereas Council deems it expedient to amend By-law 2016-110 to expand the parameters eligibility for Sensitive Receptor Applicants;

Be it therefore enacted by the municipal Council of The Corporation of the Town of Orangeville as follows:

That Section 3 (Definitions) of By-law 2016-110 as amended, is hereby further amended by deleting and replacing Section 3.11 with the following:

3.11 "Sensitive Receptor" shall include a healthcare facility, senior citizens' residence, long-term care facility, or other place where smoke may be a greater risk to the health of a group or individual, or to the environment. An individual applicant must provide proper documentation (see 9.6) and renew their application each calendar year.

And that Section 9 (Sensitive Receptor Registry) of By-law 2016-110 as amended, is hereby further amended by adding the following section after section 9.5:

9.6 An Individual Sensitive Receptor Applicant shall submit a medical note from a doctor stating the applicant has a medical condition that makes them eligible for the Sensitive Receptor Registry. This note must be provided at the time of application, and renewed each calendar year.
